The Blessing of Care

JoAnne Ganser moved to the Aurora House on February 16, 2021. Stage four cancer was racking the body of a woman who had endured many hardships and always came through adversities a little stronger and always with a positive attitude. They made sure her pain was managed and she enjoyed telling the staff about her sons. She loved the staff and was always appreciative of the care she received. JoAnne started her life as the first child of rural North Dakota Farmers, Jim and Laura Gemar. Born in the small farming community of Oakes, North Dakota. JoAnne, who was always called Jo, was born with hydro cephalitis which almost killed her mother in the birthing process. From that anxious time to her years as a hardworking farmer's daughter, Jo was always resilient and focused. Jo tended to the needs of her four other siblings and worked tirelessly for her mom and dad. She was pulled out of her classes as a sixth grader to work full time on the farm. Her dreams were lost of being a teacher. Jo moved to Fargo, North Dakota when she was 14. Soon she fell in love and married and had her first son when she was 15. All that glitters is not gold, and she learned that an abusive husband was impossible to live with. Now, 16 years old, a new baby and working in a restaurant was a daunting challenge. Jo then fell in love with Dennis Heiden from LaMoure, North Dakota and they ultimately married and had 5 more children: Dennis, Tammy, Ronald, Marty, Daryl and Milo. Jo's husband Dennis was in the Air Force, so moving around the United States for the next 19 years from Illinois, Denver, Texas, Mississippi, Nebraska, Oklahoma, Seattle, was to be the norm. A husband who was stationed in Libya, the Philippines and Alaska left JoAnne alone to tend to the needs of a large family.







JoAnne was no stranger to tragedy, her only daughter died from complications of Spina Bifida when she was five years old. Not too long after, after moving the family to West Germany with her husband, tragedy struck again. Three months shy of his 20th year in the Air Force, JoAnne's husband, was electrocuted and died in the family housing unit. Jo, now 28, was widowed with 6 boys. She moved her family back from Germany to North Dakota to move in with her mother-in-law in a two-bedroom 900 square feet house in LaMoure, North Dakota. JoAnne knew she would need help raising her family and ultimately dated and married Max Ganser in 1972. Another son was added to the family the following year, making JoAnne's family complete with seven boys. Jo filled up her life by raising boys, a big task, and finding time to garden, can her own vegetables, raise Chihuahuas, join a bowling league, sew, cook and learn her favorite craft of ceramics. She also had an incredible passion for coffee and cigarettes. The latter would ultimately claim her life.

JoAnne spend her adult life tending to her family and finally in 1995, she and Max moved to the Rio Grande Valley to retire. She really didn't retire. She and Max became involved with the American Legion where they prepared food, cooked and cleaned every weekend and holidays for the Veterans of Foreign Wars in McAllen, Texas for the next 20 years. She added knitting and crocheting to her hobby list and tirelessly made fireproof cooking pads and many other items. During the last several years of her life she fell in love with collecting Beanie Babies, Roosters and tending to the needs of her dogs. She never grew weary of baking incredible cakes and cookies for the Holidays. She was especially fond of her Shitzu, Alfie and her last Chihuahua: Chica. JoAnne's greatest asset was her common sense approach to life. She was very easy to talk to, slow to anger, a great listener and was always available to talk...day or night. Shocking to all of her family was how interested she got into sports the last few years of her life...

She paid close attention to the Texans and the Cowboys, the Olympics, Animal Planet and never missed the nightly news. She loved and laughed a lot in her time. She loved life and never grew weary of trying to do things for others. A big heart born out of a lot of hard work, pain, living and loving.

At the end, her life in Weslaco, at the Aurora House was difficult for her, but the staff at Aurora House provided that quality care, respect, dignity and comfort she deserved. Our connections with patients are always powerful and intimate. At the end of life, the simple act of being present — holding hands, listening to stories, looking at old photos, sharing music — is a profound gift, not just for the patient, but for Aurora House staff. Over the years, our patients have taught us a new kind of love. JoAnne became part of our Aurora House family and never shied away from offering her opinions on anything, but her heart was always in the right place. She knew her work on earth was almost over, but she didn't worry about herself. She asked daily how the love of her life, Max Ganser, was doing. She always wanted to know what was "new" and we believe she is at the right-hand side of her Heavenly Father asking questions in the only way JoAnne knew, with honesty and sincerity. She passed away on her 83rd birthday, May 4, 2021. She has seven surviving sons: Gene, Dennis, Ronald, Marty, Daryl, Milo and Marc; 17 grandchildren and 18 great grandchildren. JoAnne will be remembered by her family and friends as amazingly generous with her time, talents and resources. A no nonsense approach to life, and a never quit attitude.

The chaplain's primary role is to provide Spiritual/Pastoral Care to patients/residents, their family members, and the medical
